Finally, in this follow-up to Kafka's Soup, Mark Crick gives us a collection of essential DIY tips from the world's greatest writers. Fyodor Dostoyevsky tells of a young man employed by an elderly lady to re-tile her bathroom; Julius Caesar puts up a shelf for his rebellious tribe of adolescenti; and Jean-Paul Sartre is disgusted to discover in a blocked sink the revelation of his own condition. We also learn how to repair a dripping tap as Marguerite Duras would, replace a window pane with a voyeuristic Milan Kundera, and hang wallpaper under the watchful eye of Ernest Hemingway. As in Kafka's Soup, each piece is illustrated with color art purportedly by a famous artist (again impersonated by Crick), including Leonardo, Picasso, and Gorey."It's short, to the point, and when I read it out in the office, my colleagues laughed like drains."
